## **Public Safety/ Realignment**

### **\*AB 2 (Morrell)**

Mandates that sex offenders who fail to register (as a sex offender) shall be returned to prison. ***Held in Assembly Public Safety Committee***

### **AB 63 (Patterson)**

Prohibits the unauthorized removal of an electronic, global positioning system (GPS), or other monitoring device affixed as a condition of post-release community supervision parole, or mandatory supervision, making it punishable by imprisonment in the county jail for not more than one year or in the state prison for 16 months, 2 years, or 3 years. ***Died in Assembly Public Safety Committee***

### **\*AB 65 (Achadjian)**

Brings parity to statutes relating to rape by clarifying that an attacker who coerces a victim into sexual activity by impersonating somebody else can be prosecuted for felony rape.

### **AB 68 (Maienschein)**

Requires the Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation to give notice of any medical parole hearing and any medical parole release to both the county of commitment and the county of proposed release, at least 30 days prior to a medical parole hearing or a medical parole release.

### **AB 227 (Gatto)**

Provides a 14-day "right to cure" for allegations of a failure to post a Prop 65 warning.

### **AB 579 (Melendez)**

Ensures that convicted criminals who are released early from jail into mandatory supervision will begin supervision immediately upon release.

### **AB 605 (Linder)**

Imposes stricter sentencing on sex offenders who violate parole. This bill calls for a criminal parolee who has a felony requiring registration as a sex offender to be incarcerated in the state prison for any violation of that parole. This bill is necessary as a deterrent for would be repeat sex offenders. ***Died in Assembly Public Safety Committee***

### **AB 1084 (Melendez)**

Repeals weakened penalties adopted by the passage of Realignment (AB 109) and increase penalties for prohibited persons who illegally possess/acquire firearms and those who knowingly provide firearms to them. ***Died in Assembly Public Safety Committee***

**[AB 1120 \(Hagman\)](#)**

Requires the collection and public posting of vital information on those arrested for violent crimes, but who are being released prior to appearing in court due to continued jail overcrowding. ***Held in Assembly Appropriations on the Suspense File***

**[AB 1264 \(Conway\)](#)** – 2014

Requires existing school safety plans to be updated annually and include a tactical plan with specific steps to safeguard students and staff when responding to incidents, such as a shooting.

**[AB 1265 \(Conway\)](#)**

Permits the courts to authorize up to one year for assisted outpatient treatment programs for counties implementing Laura’s Law, which allows for court-ordered assisted outpatient treatment. ***Died in Assembly Judiciary Committee***

**[\\*\\*AB 1321 \(Jones\)](#)**

Adds human trafficking, solicitation to commit murder and felony child abuse to the list of “serious crimes” in the Penal Code. AB 1321 would add 18 felonies that are inherently serious crimes to the list of “serious” felonies in the Penal Code. It makes a conforming change so that these additional felonies will be considered strikes under the state’s Three Strikes law. ***Died in Assembly Public Safety Committee***

**[\\*AB 1334 \(Conway\)](#)**

Requires the Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation supervise the parole of all registered sex offenders upon release from prison. ***Died in Assembly Public Safety Committee***

**[\\*AB 1335 \(Maienschein\)](#)** – 2014

A public safety bill that gives increased sentencing to rapists who commit crimes against disabled victims.

**[AB 1438 \(Linder\)](#)** – 2014

Corrects a significant oversight that occurred during the passage of SB 1128 which unintentionally allowed convicted adults who engaged in sexual intercourse, sodomy, oral copulation, and sexual penetration with a child who is 10 years of age or younger to apply for a rehabilitation certificate. Granting this certificate means granting convicted children molesters and dangerous felons the ability to be exempt from registering as sexual offenders. AB 1438 would amend the Penal code by adding to the list of offenses for which offenders are prohibited from petitioning from relief.

**[AB 1591 \(Achadjian/Gray\)](#)** – 2014

Ensures that courts, upon determining a person to be a danger to themselves or others as a result of mental illness or disorder, will report these persons to the Department of Justice within 24 hours.

**[AB 1688 \(Conway\)](#)** – 2014

Allows local law enforcement agencies to be reimbursed by the state for costs associated with training personnel to respond to incidents of suspected abuse in developmental centers and conducting those investigations in a prompt manner.

**[AB 1715 \(Patterson\)](#)** – 2014

Closes the loophole created by AB 109 that could allow a criminal on mandatory supervision or post release community supervision who commits a violent crime to receive a sentence of additional supervision instead of jail time. AB 1715 would make mandatory supervision and post release community supervision ineligible for probation if a violent crime is committed.

**[AB 1718 \(Wagner\)](#)** – 2014

Makes propositioning a child under 16 years old a felony punishable by sixteen months in a state prison, imposes a fine up to \$25,000, and requires registration as a sex offender.

**[AB 1775 \(Melendez\)](#)** – 2014

Ensures the protection of California's children from the increase of sexual exploitation through internet child pornography by updating the code to reflect modern technology.

**[AB 1829 \(Conway\)](#)** – 2014

Prevents anyone who has been convicted of felony crimes of dishonesty or breach of trust from being hired by Covered California if he or she would have access to the financial or medical information of enrollees.

**[AB 1850 \(Waldron\)](#)** – 2014

Provides a child who was not a victim of but was physically present at the time of an act of domestic violence is a witness and is deemed to suffer harm emotionally or psychologically. This allows judges to issue protective or restraining orders for those who suffer harm of domestic violence.

**[AB 2435 \(Hagman\)](#)** – 2014

Authorizes the California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation to notify the county human services agency if a child abuse offender is scheduled to be released back to the county, who as a condition of parole is prohibited from being around children. Additionally, the county human services agency is authorized to notify law enforcement if the offender is added back on to the family's CalWORKs file. ***Died in Assembly Human Services***

**[SB 363 \(Wright\)](#)**

Provides that any person who owns or possesses any firearm and resides with an individual who he/she knows is prohibited from possessing, receiving, owning, or purchasing a firearm be required to secure the firearm within a locked container and store the firearm in a manner that the individual may not gain access to the firearm.

**[SB 828 \(Anderson, Lieu\)](#)** – 2014

This bill would make it the policy of the state to refuse material support, participation or assistance to any federal agency that authorizes the collection of electronic data or metadata of any person, unless there has been a warrant issued that specifically describes the person, place and thing to be searched or seized.

## **Education**

**[AB 51 \(Logue\)](#)**

Establishes a pilot program with the goal of creating a model of articulation and coordination among K-12 schools, community colleges, and campuses of the California State University that will allow students to earn a baccalaureate degree for a total cost not exceeding \$10,000, including textbooks. ***Held in Assembly Higher Education Committee***

**[AB 67 \(Olsen/ Chávez /Gorell\)](#)**

To ensure that Proposition 30 tax dollars are actually used to protect higher education as the voters intended, Assembly Bill 67 would freeze tuition at all UC and CSU campuses for four years. ***Held in Assembly Appropriations Committee on the Suspense File***

**[AB 138 \(Olsen\)](#)** – 2014

Guarantees a fixed tuition rate for in-state freshmen students at CSU's for a period of 4 years. ***Died in Assembly Higher Education Committee***

**[AB 239 \(Hagman\)](#)**

Transfers funds from Proposition 39 – the California Clean Energy Jobs Act, to the Office of Public School Construction where projects will be awarded through a zero interest revolving loan program. ***Died in Assembly Utilities and Commerce Committee***

**[AB 424 \(Donnelly\)](#)**

Adds the Magna Carta, the Articles of Confederation, and the California Constitution to the historical documents that must be incorporated into the history-social science framework.

**[\\*AB 815 \(Conway\)](#)** – 2014

Expands the Parent Empowerment Act to include all schools performing in the bottom 30 percent. The Parent Empowerment Act allows parents to demand change (including converting their school into a public charter) if their school has been chronically failing and at least 50 percent of parents petition for the school to be subject to a turnaround strategy. ***Died in Assembly Education Committee***

**[AB 1085 \(Gaines/Morrell\)](#)**

Restores full Cal-Grant awards for college students attending certain private colleges and trade schools. ***Held in Assembly Appropriations Committee on the Suspense File***

**[AB 1221 \(Wilk\)](#)**

Streamlines the process for suspending or dismissing teachers for unprofessional conduct or unsatisfactory performance by reducing mandated timelines, restructuring the suspension or dismissal hearing process, and allowing evidence older than four years to be introduced at a hearing. ***Held in Assembly Education Committee***

**[AB 1279 \(Conway\)](#)**

Permits students the ability to transfer to a different public school district without the explicit authorization from the resident district. ***Died in Assembly Education Committee***

**[AB 1764 \(Olsen/Buchanan\)](#)**

Encourages districts to expand computer science courses in high schools. Allows school districts to award students credit for one mathematics course if they successfully complete one course in computer science approved by the University of California and/or the California State University as a "C" requirement. Such credit would only be offered in districts where the school district requires more than two courses in mathematics for graduation.

**[AB 2092 \(Chavez\)](#)** – 2014

Requires the CSUs and requests the UCs to establish four year graduation contracts on all their campuses. If the student fails to graduate in four years due to no fault of their own, the bill would

require the school to cover the student's tuition cost to complete their degree. *Held in Assembly Appropriations Committee*

**SB 290 Veteran's In-State Tuition (Knight) – 2014**

This bill allows a student that served as a member of the Armed Forces to pay in-state tuition when seeking to further their education for up to two years following an honorable discharge. *Chaptered*

**SB 453 (Huff) – 2014**

Ensure every classroom has a great teacher: LIFO and Evaluation Reform

This bill would require or allow school districts to make staffing decisions based on performance evaluations and factors other than a teacher's date of hire. *Died in Senate Education Committee*

## **Good Government**

**ACA 4 (Olsen)**

Requires that legislation must be in print and published on the Internet for at least 15 days prior to the Legislature taking action on a bill. Also prohibits either house of the Legislature from passing a bill until the bill, in the form to be voted on, has been made available to the public, in print and published on the Internet, for at least 72 hours preceding the vote. *Held in Assembly Budget Committee*

**\*AB 70 (Morrell)**

Requires that the State budget must be available on legislative websites for 3 days before the Legislature can take a vote. *Held in Assembly Budget Committee*

**\*AB 124 (Morrell)**

Repeals the State Responsibility Area "Fire Tax." *Held in Assembly Appropriations Committee on the Suspense File*

**AB 186 (Maienschein)**

Provides an expedited process to enable military spouses who are licensed professionals in other states, to obtain a temporary California license and work here while their application for a permanent license is processed.

**AB 245 (Grove)**

Requires Western Climate Initiative, Incorporated (WCI Inc.), the Delaware-based entity established to oversee the state's cap-and-trade program, to comply with California's "Open Meeting Act." *Died in Assembly Governmental Organization Committee*

**AB 264 (Maienschein) – 2014**

Removes an onerous provision in the temporary housing assistance option for homeless families, thus allowing for more flexibility for the families to utilize the service. *Senate Appropriations Committee*

**AB 281 (Donnelly) – 2014**

Corrects a flaw in the state Vehicle Code. Fee and Penalty accrual currently does not discriminate between owners. Thus, when an individual purchases a vehicle, the fees follow that vehicle- even though the fees were incurred by the seller. The bill changes the code so that the fees follow the person responsible, rather than the vehicle. *Died in Assembly Transportation Committee*

**AB 319 (Campos)**

Provides safeguards for minors who provide their personal information to operators of websites on the internet. ***Held in Assembly Judiciary Committee***

***AB 350 (Bigelow/Wieckowski)***

Promotes fire fuel reduction and reduces bureaucratic red tape by increasing the diameter of trees that can be removed for fire prevention purposes without triggering the need to file or amend a Timber Harvest Plan. ***Died in Assembly Natural Resources Committee***

***AB 363 (Grove)***

Prohibits a state legislator from being eligible to serve on the California Unemployment Insurance Appeals Board for two consecutive years after leaving office. ***Died in Assembly Insurance Committee***

***AB 661 (Gaines)***

Requires that internal audits of agencies, conducted pursuant to the Financial Integrity and State Manager's Accountability Act of 1983 include a thorough review of revenues and expenditures and be posted on the agency's website; subjects agency heads to suspension without pay if the report is not completed and signed under penalty of perjury within 30 days of the deadline. ***Held in Assembly Appropriations Committee on the Suspense File***

***AB 718 (Melendez)***

Makes April 15 a "tax" holiday; no collection of sales tax. ***Held in Assembly Revenue and Taxation***

***AB 762 (Patterson)***

Reduces energy costs and promotes renewable energy by including hydroelectric generation in the definition of a renewable energy resource. ***Died in Assembly Utilities and Commerce Committee***

***AB 833 (Harkey)***

Creates a one-stop website portal for taxpayers dealing with the Board of Equalization, Franchise Tax Board, or Employment Development Department. Centralizing self-service options on one site will streamline filing requirements and reduce headaches for California taxpayers.

***AB 866 (Linder)***

Reforms the current regulatory process to require an economic analysis is completed for every major regulation proposed by the state. ***Held in Assembly Accountability and Administrative Review***

***AB 1049 (Harkey)***

Allows the Board of Equalization to pay taxpayers interest on their overpayments at the same rate as the interest rate these taxpayers are charged when they are late in paying their taxes. ***Held in Assembly Revenue and Taxation***

***\*AB 1313 (Donnelly)***

Funds court system by allocating up to 12 additional judicial positions each year to the counties with the greatest disparity between their current allocation and Judicial Council's recommendation. ***Held in Assembly Judiciary***

***\*AB 1436 (Waldron) – 2014***

Increases access to valuable information about residential care facilities for the elderly by requiring the Department of Social Services to post all inspection reports and other relevant materials on its website. Also, requires the state to post the number and nature of complaints filed against a facility each year. ***Held in Assembly Appropriations Committee***

**[\\*AB 1501 \(Patterson\)](#)** – 2014

Would prohibit the Authority from spending any federal funds unless state funds are legally available to the Authority for matching purposes under Prop 1A. Also, stops the Governor or High Speed Rail Authority from attempting to tap into future state funding sources without direct appropriation from the legislature. ***Died in Assembly Transportation Committee***

**[\\*AB 1507 \(Logue\)](#)** – 2014

Allows Californians who had their health plans cancelled as a result of Obamacare, to reclaim those plans through December of this year. This bill is a result of the Covered California board voting unanimously that the plans of Californians that did not measure up to federal health care guidelines had to be given up. ***Died in Assembly Health Committee***

**[\\*AB 1560 Gorell](#)** – 2014

Prohibits the Covered California Exchange from disclosing an individual's personal information to 3<sup>rd</sup> parties for purpose of determining eligibility for, or enrolling the individual in health care coverage unless, prior to the disclosure, the individual confirms his or her eligibility for a qualified health plan offered by the Exchange, and receives an estimates for the cost of the qualified health plans he or she may purchase and gives written consent to the disclosure. Requires the Exchange to immediately notify the public of any breach of the security of personal information created, collected or maintained by the Exchange, regardless of the severity of the breach and regardless of whether personal information was acquired by an unauthorized person during the breach. ***Held in Assembly Health Committee***

**[AB 1583 \(Allen\)](#)** – 2014

Follows recommendations made by the State Auditor in reports completed in 2013 to ensure that government spending is no longer hidden from the public. Specifically, AB 1583 would require the controller to prepare and submit to the legislature and the Department of Finance an annual report on all outside bank accounts and the money within them.

**[AB 1631 \(Chavez\)](#)** – 2014

Requires the Employment Development Department to review claims where multiple names are associated with a single social security number. If the department discovers that five or more names are associated with a single security number, that information shall be sent to the Department of Justice along with relevant support information as a potential incident of identity theft. ***Held in Assembly Insurance Committee***

**[AB 1651 \(Donnelly\)](#)** – 2014

Provides relief to those who suffer due to regulations, by allowing them to claim a deduction for the regulatory loss on their personal and corporate income tax returns beginning on Jan 1, 2015. ***Held in Assembly Revenue and Taxation Committee***

**[AB 1831 \(Conway\)](#)** – 2014

Eliminates the 7.5 percent threshold, allowing taxpayers to fully deduct the cost of health insurance and their health care premiums. Taxpayers are able to choose between deducting their medical insurance costs under this new deduction or as an itemized deduction for amounts paid for medical care. ***Held in Assembly Revenue and Taxation Committee***

**[AB 2065 \(Melendez/Garcia/Gorell\)](#)** - 2014

Prohibits an employee from using his or her official authority or influence for the purpose of intimidating, threatening, coercing, or commanding any person for purpose of interfering with his or her right to make a protected disclosure of improper governmental activity. Provides that any person who intentionally engages in acts of reprisal, retaliation or similar prohibited acts against a state employee or applicant for state employment for having made a protected disclosure is subject to punishment for a misdemeanor and shall be liable in action for civil damages brought by the injured party.

**[AB 2077 \(Allen\)](#) – 2014**

Cracks down on “scam charities” with the intent of protecting kindhearted individuals and the integrity of legitimate nonprofits throughout California.

**[AB 2192 \(Melendez\)](#) – 2014**

Streamlines the process of approving building permits; allows a local building department to permit architects to contract with other architects to review their plans for compliance with the building code in lieu of a building department plan review.

**[AB 2323 \(Gorell\)](#) – 2014**

Provides for various exclusions from gross income. Excludes from gross income the value of any prize or award given to a taxpayer by the United States Olympic Committee on account of either the Olympic games or the Paralympic games.

**[AB 2354 \(Conway\)](#) – 2014**

Requires all Electronic Benefit Transfer (EBT) cards in California to have photo identification on either the front or back of the card. This bill will prevent individuals from illegally selling their EBT cards and reduce incidents of theft. ***Died in Assembly Human Services Committee***

**[AB 2362 \(Grove\)](#) – 2014**

Authorizes the forfeiture of UI benefits whether the individual was prosecuted for UI benefit fraud under the penal code or the UI code.

**[AB 2374 \(Mansoor\)](#) – 2014**

Ensures that a resident’s death is reported by a residential drug and substance abuse rehabilitation facility and addressed by the department in a timely manner.

**[AB 2433 \(Mansoor\)](#) - 2014**

This bill will bring Covered California within federal guidelines by allowing people over thirty to qualify for the same coverage and help Californians adapt and prepare for the insurance they are mandated to purchase. ***Died in Assembly Health Committee***

**[AB 2456 \(Melendez\)](#) – 2014**

Requires Covered California to annually submit to the Department of Finance and the Legislative Analyst’s Office a complete and detailed performance-based budget so that it may be analyzed and included in the Governor’s budget. ***Died in Assembly Health Committee***

**[AB 2494 \(Cooley\)](#) – 2014**

Current law allows recovery of reasonable expenses if court actions are for the sole purpose of harassment. Recasts the definition of “frivolous” as “for the purpose of harassing an opposing party.”

**[AB 2510 \(Wagner\)](#) – 2014**

Requires the state to provide an automatic full refund to all individuals who paid a tax that was later declared unconstitutional or illegal. ***Held in Assembly Revenue and Taxation Committee***

**[AB 2601 \(Conway\)](#)** – 2014

Requires legislative approval of any assessments on health insurers proposed by the board of Covered California for operations and advertising. ***Died in Assembly Health Committee***

**[AB 2728 \(Perea/Linder\)](#)** – 2014

Provides funding to rehabilitate California's dilapidated roadways. AB 2728 would redirect the Truck Weight Fee revenues for their original purpose- to fund the State Highway System. ***Held in Assembly Appropriations Committee***

**[SB 312 Confidential Medical Services for Minors \(Knight\)](#)** – 2014

This measure prevents children under the age of 16 from leaving school without parental notification to seek any confidential medical service. In addition, SB 312 also increases the grade from 7th grade to 9th grade at which school districts must inform parents/guardians that students may leave campus to seek confidential medical services without their consent. ***Died in Senate Education Committee***

## **2<sup>nd</sup> Amendment**

**[AB 134 \(Logue\)](#)**

Prohibits the release of personally identifying information such as phone numbers or addresses of concealed carry weapons permit holders and applicants. ***Held in Assembly Judiciary***

**[\\*\\*AB 871 \(Jones\)](#)**

Requires law enforcement to issue a concealed weapons permit if the applicant meets the conditions of "good moral character" and states that "good cause" includes personal protection or self-defense. ***Died in Assembly Public Safety***

## **Jobs and the Economy**

**[AB 208 \(Gorell\)](#)**

Prohibits state employees from receiving a full-time state salary while also concurrently accepting hourly employment positions within the same department. ***Held in Assembly Appropriations Committee on the Suspense File***

**[AB 296 \(Wagner\)](#)**

Allows the spouse of a military service member stationed in California, to receive a provisional license to practice law in California if they meet specific criteria.

**[AB 376 \(Donnelly\)](#)**

Requires any state agency enforcing a regulation taking effect on or after January 1, 2014, to notify all businesses affected. This measure will ensure that businesses know about any new regulations prior to them taking effect. ***Held in Assembly Accountability and Administrative Review***

**[AB 486 \(Mullin\)](#)**

Provides a full state sales-and-use tax exemption for purchases of manufacturing and research and development equipment. ***Held in Assembly Appropriations Committee on the Suspense File***

**[AB 886 \(Allen\)](#)**

Protects and creates jobs for Californians statewide by providing tax incentives for infrastructure projects; expands global markets to help California's economy through the increased import and export of goods. ***Held in Assembly Appropriations Committee on the Suspense File***

**[AB 890 \(Jones\)](#)**

Conforms California law to federal "Made in America" labeling standards. Would define by statute that if a product meets guidelines as established by the Federal Trade Commission, it would, by definition meet state requirements for such labeling.

**[AB 907 \(Conway\)](#)**

Allows an employee to voluntarily request a flexible work schedule, with an opportunity to work 4/10 hour workdays without the employer incurring overtime. ***Held in Assembly Labor and Employment***

**[AB 1536 \(Olsen\)](#) – 2014**

Bans public transit unions from striking. ***Held in Assembly Public Employees, Retirement and Social Security Committee***

**[AB 1645 \(Alejo\)](#) – 2014**

Eliminates the minimum franchise tax for the first two years of companies who incorporate or do business in California. ***Held in Assembly Appropriations Committee***

**[AB 1839 \(Gatto\)](#) – 2014**

Encourages film and television productions to locate or remain in California by extending and expanding the film and television tax credit. ***Senate Governance and Finance Committee***

**[\\*AB 1889 \(Hagman\)](#) – 2014**

Reduces the costs associated with doing business in California by halving the Minimum Franchise Tax from \$800 to \$400 for small businesses in their first year of tax eligibility. This would encourage new businesses by reducing their costs of operation and make California a more business-friendly state. ***Held in Assembly Revenue and Taxation Committee***

**[AB 2031 \(Dahle\)](#) – 2014**

Establishes a threshold of annual sales of \$5,000 in qualifying lumber products, under which a retailer is not required to collect and report the lumber product assessment. This bill eases the burden for small sellers of wood products by eliminating the expense of collecting and reporting the Lumber Product Assessment on minimal sales of qualified wood products.

**[AB 2079 \(Grove\)](#) – 2014**

Seeks to limit frivolous litigation against employers regarding unintentional errors on wage statements, by allowing an employer 33 days to cure any violation before a civil action is filed. ***Died in Assembly Labor and Employment Committee***

**[AB 2095 \(Wagner\)](#) – 2014**

Seeks to limit frivolous litigation regarding itemized wage statements for alleged technical violations, that have not injured the employee by awarding attorney's fees to an employer who can prove the litigation was filed in bad faith. ***Died in Assembly Judiciary Committee***

**[AB 2164 \(Patterson\)](#)** – 2014

Creates a tax credit for businesses that invest in their employees by providing additional vocational education training – \$2,500 or 50 percent of the costs incurred per employee. ***Held in Assembly Revenue and Taxation Committee***

***\*\******[AB 2361 \(Jones\)](#)** – 2014

Provides needed relief to small businesses by prohibiting a person from bringing a Prop 65 lawsuit against a business employing fewer than 25 employees. ***Held in Assembly Environmental Safety and Toxic Materials Committee***

**[AB 2428 \(Patterson\)](#)** – 2014

This bill exempts all newly formed California businesses from corporate and franchise taxes and fees for five years; addresses the exodus of California companies to states with few taxes and regulations. ***Held in Assembly Revenue and Taxation Committee***

***\*\******[AB 2448 \(Jones\)](#)** – 2014

Permits an individual employee to request an alternative workweek schedule providing for workdays up to 10 hours within a 40-hour work week. ***Died in Assembly Labor and Employment Committee***

**[AB 2495 \(Melendez\)](#)** – 2014

Gives a five-year exemption for new businesses or businesses that relocate to California from paying the minimum franchise tax for the first five taxable years it does business in California. ***Held in Assembly Revenue and Taxation Committee***

**[AB 2688 \(Brown\)](#)** – 2014

Creates certainty for employers that they can rely upon and follow the advice received from the Division of Labor Standards Enforcement regarding how to comply with labor and employment law. ***Held in Assembly Labor and Employment Committee***

**[AB 2723 \(Medina\)](#)** – 2014

Modifies the state rulemaking process to require state agencies to consider the effect of regulations on sole proprietorships and other small businesses with assessing the economic impact of a proposed regulation. ***Senate Environmental Quality Committee***

**[SB 641 \(Anderson\)](#)** – 2014

Allows a newly formed small or micro-business the opportunity to reinvest in its future by eliminating the required minimum franchise tax of \$800 or 8.84% of gross receipts, if it qualifies, for the first four taxable years of income. ***Died in Senate Appropriations Committee***

## **Elections**

**[AB 269 \(Grove\)](#)**

Allows the ballots of military service members and other Californians living abroad to be counted up to three days after Election Day, so long as the ballots are postmarked by that day.

**\*\*AB 1157 (Jones)**

Requires voters to show photo identification at the polls in order to receive a ballot issued by the State of California, such as a driver's license or identification card, or by the U.S. government, such as a passport or military ID. ***Died in Assembly Elections and Redistricting***

**Social**

**AB 599 (Donnelly)**

Clarifies that a minor cannot receive a vaccine without the consent of the parent or guardian. ***Held in Assembly Health***

**ACA 5 (Grove)**

Prohibits a physician from performing an abortion on a minor unless the physician has delivered written notice to the parent of the minor, or that notice has been waived by the parent or a court. ***Held in Assembly Health***
