Who is Assemblymember Waldron?

Marie is a Republican who was elected to the State Assembly in 2012 and is currently serving her first two-year term. During the past two decades, Marie has been involved in North San Diego County. As a local business owner, she understands the economic impacts of burdensome government regulation and spending on the taxpayers and small businesses. As an elected official since 1998, she has fought for fiscal restraint, revitalizing our neighborhoods and is a strong supporter of public safety.

Marie and her husband, Steve Waldron have owned and operated Top End Tees Screen printing and Apparel in Escondido for 18 years. The Waldron's have a 11-year old son and Steve is the founder of the successful "Cruisin' Grand" hotrod event held in downtown Escondido for the past 12 years. Marie has a B.S. degree from St. John's University and has done graduate work at UCSD and SDSU.

Where is the 75th Assembly District?

Marie represents approximately 450,000 constituents in the following cities and communities: Bonsall, Escondido, Fallbrook, Hidden Meadows, Lake San Marcos, Rainbow, San Marcos, Temecula, Valley Center, and Vista.

What are the requirements to become an intern?

You must be a team player, self-starter, and have interest in the political process and state government. Interns will be asked to represent Assemblymember Waldron at various meetings and events in the community so reliable transportation and willingness to travel within the district are a must. A minimum of 1 semester (3-4 months) commitment is required. Weekly scheduling is flexible.

Why become an intern for Assemblymember Waldron?

Interns will have the opportunity to represent the Assemblywoman at various meetings and events in the district and will be networking with business leaders in various fields, community leaders, and elected officials. A letter of recommendation from the Assemblywoman may be earned upon completion of the program and staff will assist interns with seeking employment. Though this internship is unpaid, the experience you will receive is invaluable.

How do I apply?
